Morning:

Military	Mighty 8th Museum - Pooler	Exhibits of the 8th Air Force, from WWII to the present
Military	Midway Museum	Colonial/Revolutionary War history
Art & Architecture	Jepson Center for the Arts – Savannah	World-class art exhibitions and Savannah’s only indoor, hands-on children’s museum space
Art & Architecture	Owens-Thomas House - Savannah	Decorative arts collection, along with American and European objects dating from 1750-1830
Art & Architecture	Telfair Academy	Oldest art museum in the South

Midday: Lunch at the Historical Jekyll Club Hotel on Jekyll Island

INTEREST	MUSEUM	DESCRIPTION
Military	Historic Coast Guard Station at East Beach – St. Simons Island	Museum of St. Simons Island and the Coast Guard
Military	St. Marys Submarine Museum	Explore the life of a submariner. View a deep-sea diving suit, uniforms, models, and naval memorabilia. Explore the St. Marys River through a working periscope!
Lighthouse	St. Simons Lighthouse Museum – St. Simons Island	Museum about the lighthouse, its keepers, and life on the sea
Radio	Georgia Radio Museum & Hall of Fame – St. Marys	Antique radios, Georgia radio historical memorabilia, the interactive Georgia Radio Inductee Wall of Fame, a '40s American living room with a radio, and a typical '50s radio studio
Art & Architecture	Orange Hall House Museum – St. Marys	1830-38 antebellum mansion, housing an Austrian and a Tiffany crystal chandelier, an elegant staircase, and unique antiques
Trains	Train Museum and Model Train Display - Folkston	Railroad artifacts, genuine log books and model office used by dispatchers years ago, next to the tracks of the famous Folkston Funnel
