



Kingsland Georgia Area Sample Itinerary

DAY ONE

Begin your adventure in Kingsland with a day on the beautiful, uninhabited **Cumberland Island National Seashore**. Board the passenger ferry boat by 9:00am and enjoy a 45-minute ferry ride to Sea Camp dock. After departing the ferry, enjoy a ranger guided tour to the **Dungeness Ruins**, built by Thomas Carnegie for his wife Lucy in 1884. Other special tours include, **Plum Orchard Mansion** and a motorized tour to the north end of the Island where the **First African Baptist Church** still stands, the site where John F. Kennedy, Jr. and Carolyn Bessette were married in 1996. Enjoy a picnic lunch on the beach or under a shady oak tree, and enjoy the view! Wild horses? Why yes there are many wild horses on the Island, along with wood storks, gopher tortoises, manatees and sea turtles. Bring comfortable shoes, bug spray and your walking stick! Catch the ferry back to St. Marys, freshen up and enjoy a seafood or steak dinner overlooking the St. Marys River.



DAY TWO

Rise and Shine! Grab some breakfast and a cup of 'Joe' before your next adventure begins. Today you will enjoy a narrated boat tour of the **Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge**, one of the oldest and best preserved freshwater systems in America. Native Americans called it Okefenoka, meaning "Land of the Trembling Earth". Now this place, where earth, air, fire and water continuously reform the landscape, is preserved within the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge, created in 1937 to protect wildlife and for you to explore. There are many ways to explore the Okefenokee. Guided boat tours take visitors through cypress forests, historic canals and open prairies. Water trails and platforms allow people to canoe for the day or stay overnight deep within the 354,000 acre wilderness. Winding boardwalks and trails lead through unique habitats to observation towers and viewing platforms. Opportunities for nature photography, hunting and fishing are readily available. One can even drive a car or ride a bike to a restored homestead to discover how "swampers" once made their home here.

On the way back to Kingsland, stop by the "**Folkston Funnel**" platform, a double train track which serves as the main artery for railroad traffic into and out of Florida. Have an early dinner in Kingsland before heading to Woodbine for some southern entertainment at the **Woodbine Opry!** Enjoy an evening of bluegrass, classic country and gospel music before heading back to the hotel for the night.
